Beginning Creative Writing

Class description:

A reader lives a thousand lives! Come fall in love with literature as we journey through some of those lives together. Join us for learning and reading and musing and living anew through great books! We will read books like *To Kill a Mockingbird* by Harper Lee, short stories like "The Most Dangerous Game" by Richard Connell, and poetry that awakens the imagination and reminds us that because we don't love it all it does not mean we won't love any of it. Students will learn about literary tools that help create great literature and they will explore the worldview of authors that inevitably colors their work. They will work together in groups on one presentation on a biography they choose. Reading outside of class will be required (approximately 75 pages/week), and I will provide all the books and other materials.

Intro to Speech!

Course description:

This will be a fun class where students will learn about, construct, and practice various types of speeches: impromptu, demonstrative, persuasive, informative, motivational and others. Students will learn to critique each other in a positive and helpful way. They will practice reciting some of history's memorable and not so memorable orations as we explore the elements of a great speech. We will also learn about eye contact, projection, ridding the world's speeches (or, at least, our own) of "um" and more. Part of the grade in this class will be for improvement, which will mean different goals for different students.

Students will play games that teach concepts of grammar, and they will complete worksheets in class to demonstrate their understanding of the principles at play. Progress will be evaluated through participation in class and through completion of in-class worksheets and exams. There will be no homework, and all materials will be provided by the instructor.

Course Description:

In this course we will cover reading comprehension, vocabulary, literary terms and writing all while journeying through Middle Earth! Unit studies will also further study into Tolkien's life and literary history and how it ties into modern day literature. There will be weekly homework that will include reading, comprehension questions, vocabulary and writing 1-3 page papers. Grades will be based on class participation, writing assignments, vocabulary quizzes and 3 unit tests per semester. I will be offering test preparation video conferencing a few times during the semester because of limited class time. They are not required, but highly recommended.

English SAT Prep

Homework (35 minutes – 1.5 hours per week) will take place in the form of practice tests, studying vocab words, and writing essays.

Middle School Science

Grade Levels: 5-6

Hours of homework per week: 1+

Fee: \$170

Course description:

In the fall this class will study Middle School Physics and in the spring will study Middle School Chemistry. Class time will be spent mainly learning through hands-on labs, activities, and discussion. Students should be prepared to read their textbook and complete their homework at home to prepare for the activities that we will do together in class. Enjoying science will help us want to learn more about it!

STEM Projects

Grade Level: 5-6

Course Description:

This class will be hands-on learning of science through engineering, technology and math. We will be doing fun projects like building LEGO contraptions, logic games, hands-on math puzzles and teasers, learning electronics through component pieces and drawing the circuits, maker projects that cover topics in chemistry and physics and ending the year with learning some coding with a Micro Bit. Homework will consist of reading short articles or watching a video in preparation for class.

Junior High Science

Teacher Name: Pati Robison

Grade Levels: 6-8

Hours of homework per week: 1+

Fee: \$250

Course description:

In this course students will be exposed to introductory aspects of Biology, Chemistry, and Physical Science. At home, students will be expected to read approximately 10-15 pages of the text per week and answer questions at the end of the section. They may also be asked to find information about topics we are discussing, either online or from books, to share with the class. Tests will be given at the end of each chapter. In class, students will sing science songs, discuss the week's reading and participate in hands-on lab work.

Electronics and Robotics using Arduino

Grade Level: 7-10

Teacher Name: Teresa Rieder

Hours of homework per week: <1

Fee: \$225

Course Description:

Fall semester will be learning electronics basics and Arduino programming using an electronic kit. Spring semester will be spent using that knowledge to assemble and run their own robot. Little to no homework will be assigned for this class. Grades will be based on participation, creativity and responsibility with the electronic kits and robots.

Required Texts: Student must have a laptop for each class that is capable of running the Arduino IDE software (no Chromebooks). All other textbooks/materials will be provided by teacher. Lost or damaged electronics will have to be replaced at student's cost.

Science Olympiad

Teacher Name: see description

Grade Level: 6-12

Hours of homework per week: 1+

Fee: \$200

Course Description:

Whether your child shines at science or merely gets by, Science Olympiad will use the best aspects of competition and teamwork to challenge and reward their work.

What is Science Olympiad?

Think "Track Meet", only with science events. Students work in pairs to prepare in depth for many different types of events. Each student does around 3 or 4 events so that a team of up to 15 students covers all 25 events. We try to match each student's interests with the events assigned and the teammate selected. We then attend tournaments with other schools to compete for individual event medals and a total team score.

Science Events

There are three types of events:

Knowledge - e.g. Anatomy, Solar System,, Rocks & Minerals, Fast Facts (Science Scattergories)

Skill - e.g. Crime Buster Forensics, Experimental Design, Food Science, Optics - Laser Shoot

Build - e.g. Bridge, Hovercraft, Wind Power, Wheeled Vehicle, Glider

Preparation

Student pairs have a coach for each event who will help them to prepare according to the competition guidelines. Science Olympiad content is designed to be challenging, not aiming for mastery or memorization as much as solid understanding and application. Students will be meeting outside of designated class for each event, in either study hall times or other outside times and locations that are convenient for the students. For those who live farther away we can also use online meetings. In order to be prepared and have a successful experience in each event, students need to be committed to doing homework and getting together with coaches based on mutual availability.

Competitions

Depending on number of students we will have one or two teams competing at the Invitational(s) and Regional Competitions with other schools. If

Hudson Valley does well enough at the Regional Competition then we can go to the State Competition. We usually attend a practice tournament in January, one in February, and have our Regional competition in March, with States in April.

Class Times

Our official class meeting time is Thursday 8:00-9:30, but coaches are often available to meet with students during their study halls, which can help reduce the amount of out of class time you meet with your coaches. We encourage everyone to sign up for the Thursday class time if possible.

However, if you have a conflict, get in touch with Andrea Robinson or Allen Rhoades (high school team) to see if we can work out an alternate time to meet.

Details

As coaches, year after year we see kids learn more than they ever thought they could – even gaining a command of college level material. If you like science, there's an event for you! If you don't, you will after this!

Cost is \$200 per student. We also ask that parents participate in several fundraising projects throughout the year to help us fund the expenses of the team. Coaches: Gary & Andrea Robinson, Allen Rhoades, Nina VanValkenburgh & other volunteer coaches.

Intro to Computers

Grade Level: 5-12

Fee: \$100

A basic look at computer hardware, software, data communications, data base, system design, and project management. There will be a concentration on Web development and using HTML and CSS. We will cover various current areas of computer usages as well as some history and future expectations.

Fee: \$100

In this class you will design a website (it can be on your own or you can team up with others in the class). There will be a concentration on covering the JavaScript programming language. Prior knowledge of HTML and CSS is required.

Biology

Teacher Name: Michael Gaylo

Grade Levels: 9-12

Hours of homework per week: 1+

Fee: \$225.00

Course description:

The Biology course involves the scientific study of living organisms. It will cover the basic form and function of these organisms, from cells to organ systems, from simple viruses to complex mammals. The interactions between organisms, and between an organism and its environment will also be examined. Classroom time will consist of lecture and lab. Students will be expected to keep a lab notebook to record lab data and to submit written reports for each lab the week following the completion of the lab.

Physics

Teacher Name: Pati Robison

Grade Levels: 10-12

Hours of homework per week: 1+

Fee: \$275

Course description:

Prerequisite: Since much of Physics is math based, each student must strong in math having completed or taking Algebra II concurrently. Students must be committed to getting to class on time each day and keeping up with the work outside of class. *This is a high intensity class.*

In this year long course students will be exposed different aspects of the science of Physics. The class will meet for two class periods, one of which will be a hands-on lab. At home, students will be expected to read approximately one chapter of the textbook per week with corresponding homework sheets. There will be hands-on labs each week. This may realistically take 1-1.5 hours per day, 5 days per week. At home and in class quizzes will be given weekly. There will be a test at the end of each unit of the textbook. Students will be required to write a minimum of 3 lab reports. PLEASE BE SURE TO GET A BOOK WELL IN ADVANCE. THERE WILL BE HOMEWORK DURING THE SUMMER BEFORE CLASSES START.

Life Science

Grade Levels: 8-10

Hours of homework per week: 1+

Fee: \$250

Course description:

In this course students will be exposed to introductory aspects of Biology including taxonomy, cells, heredity, microscopy, and human biology and health. At home, students will be expected to read approximately 10-20 pages of the text per week and answer questions on a worksheet. Chapter quizzes will be given at home. Tests will be given at the end of each chapter. In class, students will discuss the week's reading and participate in hands-on lab work including dissections and using microscopes.

Required Texts: Will be supplied by the teacher.

Advanced Electronics and Robotics using Arduino

Grade Level: 8-12

Teacher Name: Teresa Rieder

Hours of homework per week: <1

Fee: \$125

Course Description:

Prerequisite – All students must have taken Introduction to Arduino OR can present working knowledge of Arduino IDE software and robot design (you must request teacher permission before registration if you have not taken the previous class). This class will be student designed and all projects for the year will be decided at our first class. All projects must be run by Arduino, but can be anything from a plant watering system or robot races.

Required Texts: Cost of building projects will be the student responsibility. Please expect to spend \$25-\$100 for project parts, unless you already own lots of parts. Student must also bring a laptop with Arduino IDE software to every class.

CSC 101 - Introduction to Computers & Applications

Teacher Name: Rachel Rice

Grade Levels: 11 and 12

Hours of homework per week: 1+

Fee: \$260

Course description:

This is an introductory college-level technology course in computer literacy, personal computers, and application software. Areas of study include the Office suite, photo/video editing, hardware configurations, purchase considerations, and online communication applications. The format of this course is largely through hands-on learning. This is a 2-credit course.

Required Texts: There is no textbook for this course. Required articles will be provided in class.

ART

Animals in Art

Hours of homework per week: 0

Fee: \$160

Course description:

Students will see the importance of animals through scripture and famous works of art. They will create their own works of art in the style of these well renowned paintings drawings and sculpture. In the process, they will learn the valuable building blocks of visual arts. All art supplies are included except for the student's sketchbook.

Mixed Media

Hours of homework per week: 0

Course description:

This course offers hands on learning through the art process.

Students will experiment with a variety of media throughout this course with an emphasis on three dimensional art. All art supplies are included except for the student's sketchbook.

Studio Art

Grade Levels: 9-12

Hours of homework per week: <1

Fee: \$160

Course description:

Students will be exposed to the elements of art and principles of design through drawing, painting, and sculpture projects. Art appreciation, the history of art, and a focus on cultural heritages will be included. This course provides a broad, general background in the visual arts. All art supplies are included except for the student's sketchbook.

Drawing and Painting

Course description:

This course will help students develop visual awareness through the study of basic drawing and painting skills. Projects will include drawing with pencils, colored pencils, sharpie, and painting with watercolor and acrylic paint. Students will be exposed to a variety of famous artists, the techniques they used and will apply those techniques to their own projects. Beginner Choir and Music Theory

The focus will be on learning solid 2-part harmony, as well as presentation techniques such as breathing, diction, tone, dynamics, and purpose. Additionally, students will be introduced to the basic elements of music theory, including solfege, note reading, rhythm, and tempo. There will be brief weekly theory material to complete at home.

Fee: \$135

Course description:

Singing a variety of musical styles, students will be introduced to choral skills, vocal techniques, musical literacy, and enjoy the camaraderie that participating in a musical ensemble brings. Class will include vocal warm ups, music activities, and rehearsal of music to be performed. Generally, there will not be homework with the small exception of memorizing music or reviewing a section as needed before performance.

Course description:

Students are introduced to the art of music and its materials with emphasis on the development of listening skills. The course will cover elements of music, musical genres, world music, music and the musician in culture, and concert attendance.

Homework will include reading chapters in the text as well as listening and written reflections to be used as part of class discussions.

MATH

Math in Focus 4

Teacher Name: Tracy Greenwald

Grade Level: 4

Hours of homework per week: 1+

Fee: \$150

Course description:

This comprehensive math curriculum is based upon the Singapore teaching method, emphasizing math concepts through activities and real-world applications. Each class will consist of math games and drills, a unit lesson, problem-solving activities, and practice exercises. Students will then complete homework throughout the week and tests will be sent home to be administered by parents and returned to class.

Topics include; whole numbers, fractions, decimals, geometry, lines and graphs, data and probability.

Required Supplies: Singapore Math in Focus textbook 4A and 4B, Singapore Math in Focus workbook 4A and 4B, three-ring binder with paper, graph paper, ruler, protractor, compass, and calculator.

Math in Focus 5

Teacher Name: Tracy Greenwald

Grade Level: 5

Hours of homework per week: 1+

Fee: \$150

Course description:

This Singapore teaching method builds math skills by emphasizing concepts and real-world applications. Each class will consist of math games and drills, a unit lesson, problem-solving activities, and practice exercises. Students will have homework assignments to complete throughout the week, and tests will be sent home to be administered by parents and sent back to class. Topics include whole numbers, fractions, decimals, percents, ratios and rates, geometry, graphing, and introductory algebra. This is a comprehensive math program covering all the basics for grade 5 with activities to build understanding and confidence.

Required Supplies: Singapore Math in Focus textbook 5A and 5B, Singapore Math in Focus workbook 5A and 5B, three-ring binder with paper, graph paper, ruler, protractor, compass, and scientific calculator.

Math 6

Teacher Name: Nina Van Valkenburgh

Grade Levels: 6

Hours of homework per week: 1+

Fee: \$150

Course description:

This course will teach 6th grade math using Singapore Math in Focus which is based on the Singapore teaching method and common core aligned. Math in Focus is a curriculum with problem solving as the center of math learning and concepts taught through real-world, hands-on experiences. In class students will be given weekly math facts drills, taught 2-4 lessons within a unit and use hands on manipulatives to better grasp newly introduced material. I will work with students to complete guided practice problems before sending them home to continue honing their developing skills. Topics covered in the sixth grade include: Positive and Negative Integers, multiplying and dividing fractions and decimals, ratio, rates, percent, algebraic expressions, equations and inequalities, the coordinate plane, area of polygons, circumference and area of circle, surface area and volume of solids, intro to statistics and measure of central tendency. This Math 7 course will follow the Math in Focus Singapore Math curriculum for grade 7. Students will learn to classify numbers within the system of Real Numbers, perform operations with Rational Numbers, write and simplify algebraic expressions, solve algebraic equations and inequalities, reason proportionally by representing direct proportions in tables, graphs, and equations, as well as identify indirect proportions, classify angle relationships, perform geometric constructions, find volume and surface area of geometric solids, represent data using various statistics and visual representations, and find the probability of events. Class sessions will include math facts drills, lesson instruction, and guided practice exercises. Students will be expected to complete follow-up homework assignments and tests at home, which will require 45-60 minutes each weekday with support and feedback from parents as needed. Course description:

Mock Trial is an activity in which students learn the principles of trial advocacy and then apply those principles as they try a fictitious case. Aside from getting a jump on college, involvement in Mock Trial fosters increased self-confidence, improved analytical and speaking skills and the ability to work well with others – not to mention, it’s a lot of fun. The first semester will provide an understanding of the rules and process of Mock Trial. The fictitious case will be tried during the second semester. Students must sign up for Mock Trial both semesters in order to participate in competitions. Students will have little homework (less than 1 hour per week) for much of the first semester. The time commitment increases significantly as the competition begins in the Spring when students will need extra time outside of class to prepare. In addition, most competitions take place outside normal business hours (evenings and weekends) when the volunteers are available.
