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ENGLISH

Classics in Literature

Teacher Name: Lori Kehoe

Grade Levels: 5-8

Hours of homework per week: 2 hours (including reading)

Fee: \$ 175

Class Description:

A reader lives a thousand lives! Come fall in love with literature as we journey through some of those lives together. Join us for learning and reading and musing and living anew through great books! We will read a variety of books, short stories, and poetry that awakens the imagination. Students will learn about literary tools that help create great literature and they will explore the worldview of authors that inevitably colors their work. They will work together in groups on one presentation on a biography they choose. Reading outside of class will be required (approximately 75 pages/week), and I will provide all the books and other materials.

Grammar and Vocabulary (5th-8th)

Teacher Name: Lori Kehoe

Grade Levels: 5-8

Hours of homework per week: >2

Fee: \$150

Course description:

In this grammar class, students will have the opportunity to learn grammar skills in a fun, engaging environment. Class members will work with IEW's award winning Fix It! Grammar and Simply Charlotte Mason's prepared dictation program in a way that demonstrates their understanding of parts of speech. Students will also discover how those parts of speech work together in sentences. Students will play games that teach concepts of grammar, and they will be assigned homework to demonstrate their understanding of the principles at play. Progress will be evaluated through participation in class, completion of work in and outside of class and exams.

ELA for Middle School

Teacher: Lori Kehoe **Grade Levels:** 5-8

Hours of homework per week: 1-2

Fee: \$150

Course Description:

This fun and engaging faith-based course will cover a range of language arts skills: reading, writing, spelling, literature and some grammar and punctuation. We will have robust discussions about books and poetry and explore the reason that language arts are essential to our overall academic success and our enjoyment of the world that God has given us.

Access Language Arts Through Literature

Teacher: Teresa Rieder

Grade Level: 6-8

Hours of homework per week: 1-2

Fee: \$160

Course Description:

This complete Language Arts program is designed for the learner that prefers to move at a slower pace or needs a little remediation during these middle grade years. We will be reading "The Incredible Journey" during the Fall semester and "The Hobbit" during the Spring semester. I highly encourage struggling readers to read along to audio books.

I will be covering all language arts topics such as reading comprehension, grammar basics, spelling, vocabulary, paragraphs and the 5 paragraph essay. All tests will be taken at home using Google Forms.

I use Google Classroom to keep students and parents updated with classroom happenings, post easy to find links as well as a place to ask questions.

Excellence in Writing: Narnia II

Teacher: Renee Capuano

Grades: 5-8

Homework: 1-2 hours a week

Fee: \$130

Course Description: Continue the adventure with the remaining four novels of The Chronicles of Narnia® (Prince Caspian, The Voyage of the Dawn Treader, The Silver Chair, and The Last Battle). Students will learn advanced writing skills while exploring the enchanted land of Narnia through the Structure and Style® writing method. Students will write on topics from the Narnia stories, but also from history and science.

This course develops composition, grammar, and vocabulary skills. Students will not only write on topics from the Narnia stories, but also from history and science. Topics Included: Outlines, Narrative Stories, Summarizing, Writing from Pictures, Research, Inventive Writing and Critiques.

While this course continues the Narnia series, there are no prerequisites. The current four year rotation of writing texts is US History Based Writing Lessons, Modern World Writing Lessons, Narnia, Volume 1 and Narnia, Volume 2.

Grade Levels: 5-8

Hours of homework per week: 1-2

Fee: \$150

Course description:

This class will provide students with the skill set to tap into their own creativity and allow them to express their ideas in better, more engaging ways. We will hone the craft and adventure of creative writing allowing each student to explore in-depth their own strengths and interests. Students will learn the basic elements of fiction writing including narrative, scene, and character. In addition, students will strengthen basic skills such as descriptive writing and dialogue. Each week will look at a new short story pulling out the best of each author and incorporating it into our own writing. Homework for each week will include reading a short story and some writing. Writing will be done both at home and in class. Students will have the opportunity to workshop their writing with their peers and receive teacher feedback for improvement.

English SAT Prep/College & Careers

Grade Levels: 11 - 12

Hours of homework per week: 1 – 2 hours a week

Fee: \$125

Course description: This year-long class is the merger of English SAT Prep and Colleges & Careers. Students enrolled in the class with take 7 full-length practice SAT tests and will master effective test-taking strategies. Additional homework will be assigned weekly. Concurrently students will explore a variety of different careers, engage in self-exploratory exercises similar to the Myers-Briggs, determine which colleges would suit them best, and become familiar with the college application process. Students should plan on roughly two hours of homework each week. This class is best for juniors and seniors; advanced sophomores will also benefit from it.

Grade Levels: 8-12

Hours of homework per week: < 1

Fee: \$150

Course Description:

Students will have the opportunity to learn basic grammar, punctuation, and usage in a fun, engaging environment. Class members will learn about parts of speech and discover how those parts of speech work together. We will use two additional programs to expand understanding of proper usage that teach usage issues and a stronger focus on punctuation. Students will play games that teach concepts of grammar, and they will complete worksheets in class to demonstrate their understanding of the principles at play. Progress will be evaluated through participation in class and through completion of in-class worksheets, exams and homework.

Grammar & *CLEP Prep

Teacher Name: Lori Kehoe

Grade Levels: 9-12

Hours of homework per week: < 2

Fee: \$150

Course description:

In this class, students will have the opportunity to learn grammar skills in a fun, engaging environment. We will work through CLEP study materials and class members will be taking practice College Composition CLEP tests. While we will complete full practice tests and work together to improve scores through focused study of challenging areas, all students should complete a full writing class in addition to the work we will do together in this class. Students will play games that teach concepts of grammar, and they will be assigned homework to demonstrate their understanding of the principles at play. Progress will be evaluated through participation in class, completion of assigned work, and exams.

*CLEP stands for College-Level Examination Program. Students of any age can take CLEP tests offered in various locations and even online. Many colleges, both secular and Christian, accept the CLEP test for college credit. That means that for the cost of the exam, a student can receive full college credit for a class he/she doesn't actually take. This saves both time and money.

Language Arts with Lord of the Rings

Grade Level: 8-10

Hours of homework per week: 1-2

Fee: \$160

Course Description:

In this course we will cover reading comprehension, vocabulary, literary terms and writing all while journeying through Middle Earth! Unit studies will also further study into Tolkien's life and literary history and how it ties into modern day literature. There will be weekly homework that will include reading, comprehension questions, vocabulary and writing 1-3 page papers. Grades will be based on class participation, writing assignments, vocabulary quizzes and 3 unit tests per semester. I will be offering test preparation video conferencing a few times during the semester because of limited class time. They are not required, but highly recommended. Homework may take longer than 1-2 hours during heavy and/or testing weeks, but I try to spread everything out as much as possible and encourage students to read ahead when they have free time to lessen the workload!

Reasoning and written articulation skills will be practiced through a series of interrelated exercises.

Middle School Computer Skills for Students

Teacher Name: Liz Huisjen

Grade Level: 5-8

Hours of homework per week: <1

Cost per semester: \$125 Course description:

Computer basics with a focus on productivity applications including Microsoft Word, Excel, and Powerpoint; Google Docs, Sheets, and Slides; and potentially Apple Pages, Numbers, and Keynote. We will focus on using the programs for both education and business applications. Digital citizenship will also be covered including topics such as: online responsibility, media balance, privacy and security, and digital wellbeing. We also explore navigating the Internet, understanding hardware and software, and basic troubleshooting. Mac or Windows computer with Office 2019 or Office 365 installed is required. Science Detectives

Teacher Name: Sarah Devernoe

Grade Level: 5-8

Hours of homework per week: approximately one hour per week.

Cost per semester: \$150

This fun science enrichment class will cover a sampling from a variety of science topics including biology, nutrition, earth science, physical science and forensics. Students will work individually and in groups during class to solve science mysteries, conduct experiments, write analysis and present results/conclusions.

Required Texts: Will be supplied by teacher.

5/6 Science - Chemistry

Teacher Name: Antoinette Ruffino

Grade Level: 5th and 6th

Hours of Homework: less than 2 hours

Fee: \$190

Course Description:

This is a year long chemistry class. The course uses Christian Kids Explore Chemistry (grades 4-8th) by Robert and Elizabeth Ridlon and additional supplemental sources ie: videos to help demonstrate concepts. Students will learn the basics of chemistry including matter, measuring, elements, molecules and compounds. Weekly classes will include a review/follow up, and new lessons. Students will have fun learning the concepts by participating in hands-on activities and experiments. Weekly vocabulary will be assigned as homework and element cards (periodic table) will be completed in class or at home. When appropriate students will be provided with lab sheets to record experiments. Students may be asked to complete the lab sheets at home and reflect on what they would do differently. Unit reviews will be completed in class. Reviews will consist of review questions found at the end of each lesson and vocabulary words completed at home. Jeopardy and bingo will be utilized to engage and solidify the unit review concepts. Weekly updates and homework assignments will be provided via ThinkWaye.

7/8 Science - General Science

Teacher Name: Denise Roy

Grade Levels: 7-8

Hours of Homework per week: 1-2

Fee: \$170

Class Description:

This course is a General Science designed to help students transition from middle school to high school sciences. Students will be exposed to different topics including Earth Science, Chemistry, Physics, Life Sciences, Biology, Marine and Environmental Sciences. We will focus on scientific inquiry and the scientific method while documenting and interpreting experimental results. Students will read the textbook at home and we have discussions and hands on experiments in class. There will be weekly homework and chapter quizzes.

STEM Projects and Concepts

Grade Level: 5-6

Teacher Name: Teresa Rieder

Hours of homework per week: <1

Fee: \$190

Course Description:

This class will be hands-on learning of science through engineering, technology and math. We will be doing fun projects like launching rockets, building bridges, logic games, hands-on math puzzles and teasers, learning electronics through component pieces and maker projects that cover topics in chemistry, physics, biology and engineering as well as ending the year with learning some circuitry and coding with a Micro;bit. Homework will consist of reading short articles or watching a video in preparation for class.

Required Texts: All supplies will be provided by the teacher.

Life Science

Teacher Name: Pati Robison

Grade Levels: 8-10

Hours of homework per week: 2-3

Fee: \$250 per semester **Course description**

In this course students will be exposed to introductory aspects of Biology including taxonomy, cells, heredity, microscopy, and human biology and health. At home, students will be expected to read approximately 10-20 pages of the text per week and answer questions on a worksheet. Chapter quizzes will be given at home. Tests will be given at the end of each chapter. In class, students will discuss the week's reading and participate in hands-on lab work including dissections and using microscopes.

Science Olympiad

Grade Levels: 5-9

Hours of homework per week: 2+ hours

Fee: \$200

Course description:

Fun science! Thrilling competitions! Teamwork! Great for college applications! (You do not have to be a science genius to be great at Science Olympiad!)

Science Olympiad is a nationwide organization that uses a fun competition format to encourage kids to excel in science events. Think "Track Meet", only with science events. Students work in pairs to prepare in depth for many different types of events to win individual and team medals.

Types of Events

Knowledge – i.e. Anatomy, Solar System, Rocks & Disease Detectives Skill – i.e. Crime Buster Forensics, Experimental Design, Food Science, Optics – Laser Shoot

Build – e.g. Bridge, Hovercraft, Wind Power, Wheeled Vehicle, Glider A full listing of this year's events can be viewed at https://www.soinc.org. The B Div is for grades 5-9.

Preparation

Student pairs have a coach for each event who will help them to prepare according to the competition guidelines. Science Olympiad content is designed to be challenging, not aiming for mastery or memorization as much as understanding and application. Students will be meeting outside of designated class time for each event, in either study hall times or other outside times and locations that are convenient for the students. We work with your schedule! We also ask that parents participate as available in helping the team with a variety of tasks (even coaching if you have a particular specialty).

Class Times

Our official class meeting time is Thursday 8:00-9:30, but if you have a conflict, get in touch with Andrea Robinson) to see if we can work out an alternate time to meet. Students need to be available to attend our Regional competition, which is one Saturday in February or March, and if we qualify for the NY State Tournament, another Saturday in April.

As coaches, year after year we see kids learn way more than they ever thought they could – even gaining a command of college level material. If you like any aspect of science at all, there's an event for you! If you don't, you will after this!

Intro to Electronics and Robotics using Arduino

Grade Level: 7-10

Teacher Name: Teresa Rieder **Hours of homework per week:** <1

Fee: \$225

Course Description:

Fall semester will be learning electronics basics and Arduino programming using an electronic kit. Spring semester will be spent using that knowledge to assemble and run their own robot. Little to no homework will be assigned for this class. Grades will be based on participation, creativity and responsibility with the electronic kits and robots.

Required Texts: Students must have a laptop for each class that is capable of running the Arduino IDE software (no Chromebooks). All other textbooks/materials will be provided by the teacher. Lost or damaged electronics will have to be replaced at student's cost.

This course is meant for those students who know a little about Python and also those who know absolutely nothing! We'll be working our way through an online course using starting with coding basics and working our way into Python. Google Classroom will be used for posting updates and sharing our progress and also posting helpful links as we learn.

Physics

Teacher Name: Pati Robison

Grade Levels: 10-12

Hours of homework per week: 4-5+

Fee: \$275 per semester

Prerequisite: Since much of Physics is math based, each student must strong in math having completed or taking Algebra II concurrently. Students must be committed to getting to class on time each day and keeping up with the work outside of class. This is a high intensity class.

Course description:

In this year long course students will be exposed to different aspects of the science of Physics. The class will meet for two class periods, one of which will be a hands-on lab. At home, students will be expected to read approximately one chapter of the textbook per week with corresponding homework sheets. There will be hands-on labs each week. This may realistically take 1-1.5 hours per day, 5 days per week. At home and in class quizzes will be given weekly. There will be a test at the end of each unit of the textbook. Students will be required to write a minimum of 3 lab reports. PLEASE BE SURE TO GET A BOOK WELL IN ADVANCE. THERE WILL BE HOMEWORK DURING THE SUMMER BEFORE CLASSES START.

Biology

Teacher Name: Michael Gaylo

Grade Levels: 9-12

Hours of homework per week: 2+

Fee: \$250.00

Course description:

The Biology course involves the scientific study of living organisms. It will cover the basic form and function of these organisms, from cells to organ systems, from simple viruses to complex mammals. The interactions between organisms, and between an organism and its environment will also be examined. Classroom time will consist of a lecture and lab. Students will be expected to keep a lab notebook to record lab data and to submit written reports for each lab the week following the completion of the lab.

Advanced Robotics using Arduino & Raspberry Pi

Grade Level: 8-12

Teacher Name: Teresa Rieder

Hours of homework per week: <1

Fee: \$125

Course Description:

Prerequisite – All students must have taken Introduction to Arduino OR can present working knowledge of Arduino IDE software and robot design (you must request teacher permission before registration if you have not taken the previous class). This class will be student designed and all projects for the year will be decided at our first class. All students attending this class for the first year must come up with projects run by Arduino, like a plant watering system or robot races. For students attending this class for the second (or after) year, projects in Raspberry Pi can be added. For many students this will be a new platform and I do suggest taking my Python coding class either prior to or concurrently with the year they pick up Raspberry Pi (since this is the primary coding language of Raspberry Pi). Students will be responsible for purchasing all their own parts and equipment. There is generally no homework for this class unless the student would like to continue working on their projects outside of class.

Required Texts: Cost of building projects will be the student responsibility. Please expect to spend \$25-\$200 for project parts, unless you already own lots of parts. Students must also bring a laptop with appropriate software to every class.

Hours of homework per week: Less than 1 hour

Fee: \$170.00

Grade Levels: 5-12

Hours of homework per week: <1

Fee: \$135

Course description:

Singing a variety of musical styles, students will be introduced to choral skills, vocal techniques, musical literacy, and enjoy the camaraderie that participating in a musical ensemble brings. Class will include vocal warm ups, music activities, and rehearsal of music to be performed. Generally, there will not be homework with the small exception of memorizing music or reviewing a section as needed before performance.

Hours of homework per week: 0

Fee: \$130

Course description:

This is a great course for students who have any level of musical experience and will allow for a wide range of musical exploration and experiences.

I wish this course were available at my school. While I did well in traditional math, there was no blueprint in class for how to approach money in real life. Students will learn to be prepared to avoid pitfalls and build a mindset of saving, giving, and spending wisely both in the short and long term. Yes, by starting now and following a simple mindset, high school students will be on a solid, not just dreamy, path to being millionaires by the time they retire. In addition to learning through using Foundations in Personal Finance: High School Edition for Homeschool by Dave Ramsey, we will also learn through real money activities loosely using My Classroom Economy by Vanguard. Students will rent their desks, get paid for homework, bid on auction items, open a business for a few days at consortium, prepare for classroom "disasters" through insurance, etc., and interview an entrepreneur. We will work on researching and applying for a minimum of two scholarships. (No money outside of the cost of the class will ever be expected or allowed.) Most importantly, this class will teach gratitude and contentment in all things as we seek to glorify God.

Prerequisite: For students who have passed Math 6 or demonstrate equivalent skills. This Math 7 course will follow the Math in Focus Singapore Math curriculum for grade 7. Students will learn to classify numbers within the system of Real Numbers, perform operations with Rational Numbers, write and simplify algebraic expressions, solve algebraic equations and inequalities, reason proportionally by representing direct proportions in tables, graphs, and equations, as well as identify indirect proportions, classify angle relationships, perform geometric constructions, find volume and surface area of geometric solids, represent data using various statistics and visual representations, and find the probability of events. Class sessions will include math facts drills, lesson instruction, and guided practice exercises. Students will be expected to complete follow-up homework assignments and tests at home, which will require 45-60 minutes each weekday with support and feedback from parents as needed. Some students may require more learning support than the weekly class time allows; in this case, the student should also sign up for a Math Tutoring class. Internet access at home will be beneficial for accessing additional teacher-provided resources to support weekly lessons and homework.

Course description:

This course will follow the Math in Focus Singapore Math curriculum for grade 8 which is based on the Singapore teaching method, is Common Core aligned, and is a curriculum with problem solving as the center of math learning and concepts taught through real-world, hands-on experiences. During the 1.5 hour class, students will be taught the unit lessons and given guided practice exercises. Students are expected to complete follow-up assignments and tests at home which are to be turned in during the next class. The expectation is that students will spend 45-60 minutes each 4 to 5 times per week completing assignments with support and feedback from parents as needed. Some students may require more learning support than the weekly class time allows. In this case, the student should also sign up for a math tutoring class.
